I. Call to Order Chair Duda called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m. and stated that the meeting was being

conducted in compliance with Nebraska's Open Meetings law, a copy of which is located on the

back wall.

Chair Duda called for the Roll at 9:02 a.m. Trustees Borgeson, Boyle and Morgan were absent.

II. Consent Agenda Chair Duda called for a motion to approve the Consent Agenda at 9:08 a.m. Trustee Kraft moved,

and Trustee Rodgers seconded. Chair Duda called for the vote. Yeas: Duda, Cavanaugh, Kraft, &

Rodgers. Absent were Borgeson, Boyle, and Morgan. Motion passed.

III. Citizen Comments Chair Duda called for members of the audience to be heard regarding any item not on the

agenda.

IV. Action Nothing at this time.

V. Discussion

a. DCHC Nurse Staffing Speaking: Ranae Manning, DeDe Will, Karen Buche, Judy Delgado, Erin Nelson, Patrick Bloomingdale, Trustee Duda, Trustee Cavanaugh, Trustee Rodgers.

Regarding the open positions and mandating: There is not enough staff for mandating 31 shifts. Absences happen often due to Sick Time and FMLA usage. Mandating also is occurring due to Staff turnover. Solutions under discussion include using more agency staff, continued mandating, along with revising on-boarding processes and more nursing students.

Trustee Duda asked where we are now; Ranae Manning responded that we are still mandating; We are increasing on-boarding of other schools, and we are expecting more retirements.

Trustee Cavanaugh, referencing a handout given to the Trustees, would like the report sent electronically. 21 people left our employment from all nursing subsets. We have 54 Nurses, 151 Nursing Assistants, and 16 Medication Aides for a total of 221. The numbers indicate a 10 % turnover rate which cannot be consistently sustained. DeDe Will said that there were 31 hired in that period. Trustee Cavanaugh asked where we are experiencing the turnover. Ranae Manning went over the numbers from the handouts. Trustee Cavanaugh noticed the frequency of the mandated shifts going up dramatically.

Trustee Cavanaugh ask more questions about mandating and diagnosing the staffing shortages. Judy Delgado noted that Madating has been in place at least for the six years she has been here. Patrick Bloomingdale responded to the Family Leave act impact saying that this is a 24 hour facility and that is part of the deal. The same with mandating. It is not unusual for a facility of this size.

Karen Buche responded to the staffing shortage by saying that postings are processed on a daily basis.

Ranae Manning will make the report quarterly and will be more specific about what jobs all of the numbers represent. Karen will get information about other facilities and what hiring incentives they are offering. Loan Forgiveness and Signing Bonuses are pretty common.

Trustee Rodgers asked about Nursing schools and is Clarkson the only one. Ranae Manning will reach out for more partnerships.

Judy Delgado described current in-boarding (pre-employment) processes. She will work with Staff Development to offer more orientation classes. Twice a month was suggested.

Speaking Further were Sherry Glasnapp, Ranae Manning, Judy Delgado, and Trustee Kraft.

Glasnapp noted that graduates often work for their colleges and other more "Glamorous" jobs. Delgado noted that the medical schools associated with hospitals may have a pool of 5000 nursing staff, so mandating is not done as often for them. Nursing grads do not was LTC. Trustee Kraft asked about hiring 50 and over. Ranae Manning added that quite often, we hire 50 and over. Trustee Kraft suggested AARP as an advertising source.

Mike Phillips reported a high level of recidivism with Corrections, and they have developed a plan of interventions beginning with a long acting injectable Medications for those who are incarcerated with mental health issues. When released they can be introduced to Out-Patient Services so they can continue the service and not miss a dose of required medications.

2. HFAP - did you know?

Speaking was Sherry Glasnapp and Chair Duda

Jess Woodard and Kymi Black from CMHC attended an HFAP (formerly AOA) training in Chicago, along with Zach Wellman and Jeff McGill from Public Properties. CMHC has been meeting regularly to prepare. HFAP is going to be looking at the policies of the support services to make sure they are meeting accreditation standards. They will meet with staff to make sure the staff understands and are following those policies and procedures. Ms. Glasnapp explained that many of the items on the consent agenda were directly related to HFAP. Chair Duda stated that the changes that need to be made to be compliant with the ligature assessment had the potential to be very costly.

3. Ligature Assessment Update

Speaking was Sherry Glasnapp, Jerry Leahy, Patrick Bloomingdale, and Chair Duda

CMHC has been working with Jeff McGill and his team in Public Properties to move forward with the ligature assessment. Mr. Jerry Leahy suggest using the same contractor that was used in the Correctional Facility. Mr. Bloomingdale suggests doing the minimum of what is required and deal with the citings. Ms Glasnapp replied that HFAB can come in unannounced anytime from January to May , and if they find something, CMHC will have 60 days to fix it - Keep in mind that doors take 6 weeks to come in once ordered.

Trustee Cavanaugh asked about Ligature hangings and how often this happens here at CMHC. Glasnapp responded that the last one was 20 years ago.

HFAP (Healthcare Facility Accreditation Program)

This is a national focus is to reduce the number of sucessful suicide attempts.

CMHC, Hospitals and Mental Health Certification.

Per Joe Lorenz This is partially funded with \$350,000 encumbered funds. There was further discussion about the funding, evaluations and engineering.

4. Social Detoxification

Speaking to this topic are: Sherry Glasnapp, Teri Speck, Trustee Kraft and Trustee Duda.

The State would like us to work with the region to reduce the number of staff. Per Ms Glasnapp, Due to the risk & liability you cannot work with one staff on each side. Added to the discussion was the possibility of negotiation with the city for extra staff for guards in the hallway 24/7.
