If your loved one should be tested for COVID-19, or another resident on your loved-one's floor tests positive, you will be personally notified.

We continue to work very closely with the local and state health departments and our UNMC Infectious Disease consultant. We follow the most current recommendations of the CDC on preventative steps and the regulations of Centers for Medicare and Medicaid and Department of Health and Human Services.

In order to minimize the threat of increased COVID diagnoses, we will maintain current visitation restrictions, and continue to screen residents/visitors/staff, adhere to appropriate precautions, including wearing required personal protective equipment, practice good hand hygiene and keep the environment as clean and clutter-free as possible. In the near future, we will be sending out additional communication regarding what everyone can do to help keep resident rooms organized and personal belongings at a level manageable for effective cleaning and overall safety of staff and residents.
