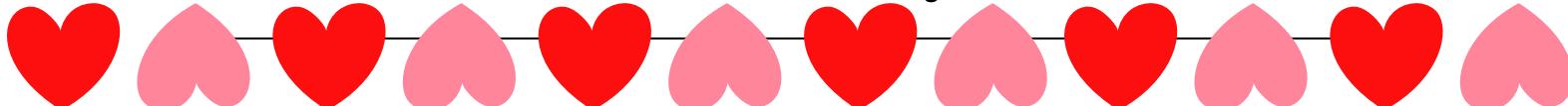

Why Heart Health Matters

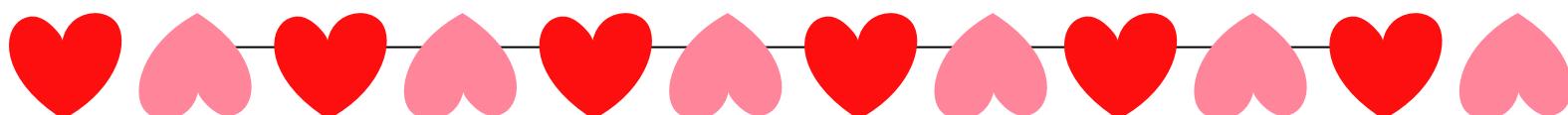

Key Risk Factors to Know:

- High blood pressure
- High cholesterol
- Smoking

Simple Ways to Support a Healthy Heart

- Aim for at least 150 minutes of moderate physical activity per week

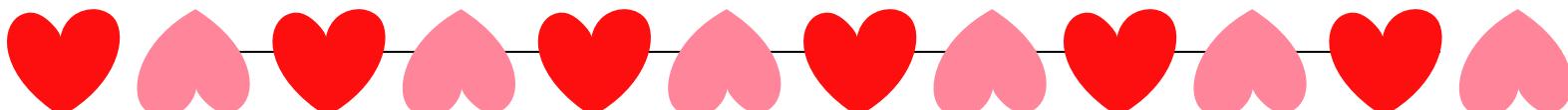

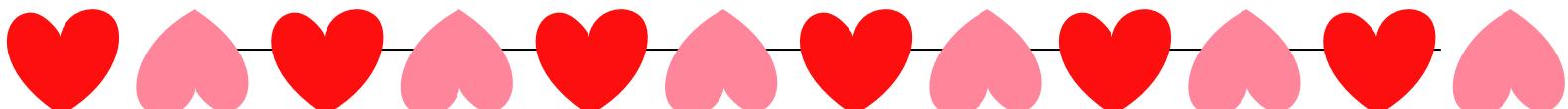
Resident of the Month **January 2026**

Betty was born in Malin, Oregon, and grew up as the second oldest of six children, with five brothers. When she was seven years old, her family moved to Vale, Oregon. Her father worked for Farmers Consumers, selling farming equipment, and later purchased a farm where the family raised dairy cows.

By the time Betty was eight, she was already helping out on the farm, caring for cows, chickens, and tending the garden. She lived on the farm with her family until she was nineteen, when she met her husband, Daris. Daris had recently been discharged from the Navy and was working for the same company as Betty's father, though in a different department.

In May of 1949, Betty and Daris moved to Harper, Oregon, after Daris accepted a job with the railroad. His work required him to walk a one-mile tunnel twice a day to ensure it was clear of debris. Betty often joined him, and together they walked four miles each day. During this time, they raised chickens, rabbits, turkeys, and pigs, and welcomed their first daughter, Janice.

In November 1951, the family moved to the Ruby Lake Game Refuge near Wells, Nevada. Daris worked as an office clerk and game warden, while Betty stayed home caring for their household. The refuge was home to ten other families, creating a close-knit community. During this time, Betty and Daris welcomed their second daughter, Susan. The families often gathered for large potlucks and dancing nights, always helping one another.



In 1954, they moved to Sandy, Utah, to help Betty's mother settle into her home. Daris found work as a machinist near Granger, Utah, and Betty took a job with Litton Data Systems to help save money for remodeling their home. She worked there for ten years. After spending time at home until her youngest daughter moved out, Betty began working at the Granger Branch Library, where she served as head clerk.

Eventually, Betty and Daris retired and moved to Richfield, Utah, where they spent twenty happy years together. In 2010, Daris passed away. A few years later, Betty decided to move to St. George in 2015.

She settled into Sterling Court, where she enjoys meaningful friendships and staying active through the many activities offered.

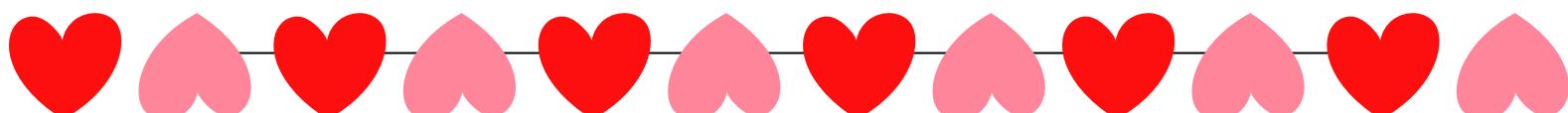
Employee of the Month

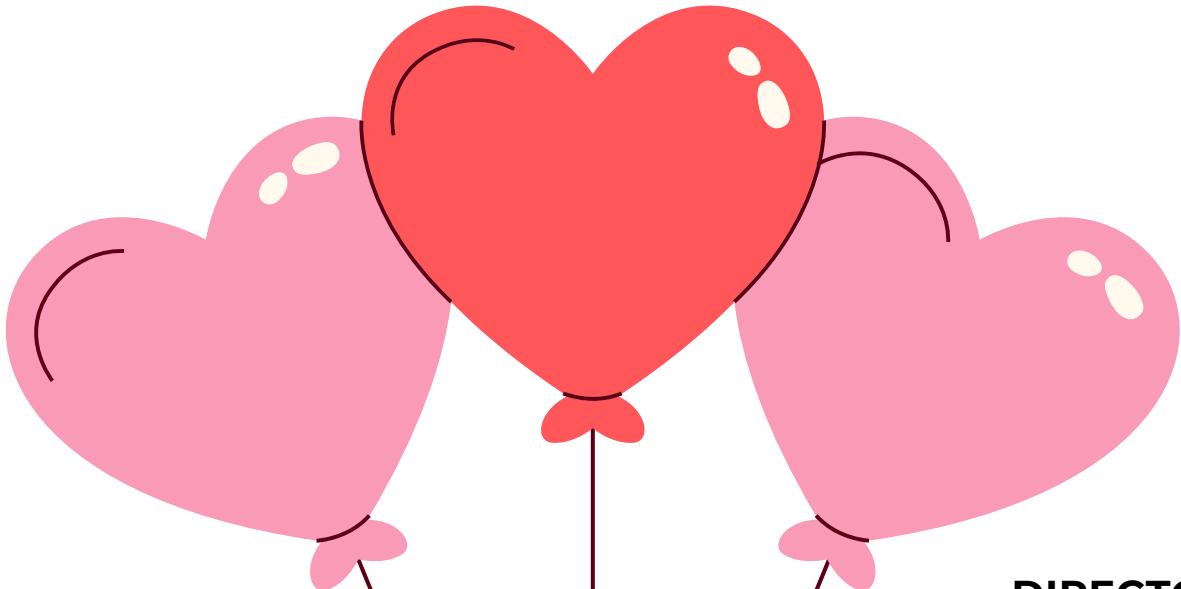
February 2026
